



#### **COMPONENTS:**

- 10 x photo cards
- 10 x quote cards
- 1 x Answer card

#### **OBJECTIVE OF THE GAME:**

The objective of this game is to use photographs to explore how young refugee volunteers in Uganda interpret their volunteering experiences.

### **SETTING UP THE GAME:**

- This game can be played by 2-3 people.
- At the beginning of the game, **place the answer sheet card facing down** so that players do not see the correct answers until the end of the game.
- Place the Photo Cards in front of you facing up, so that all players can see them clearly.
- Shuffle the Quote Cards and put them in front of you facing down so that the players can't read them.
- Turn over the Quote Cards one at a time and read aloud the quote written on the card.
- Discuss with other players which picture best matches each quote. Place the Quote Card next to the respective Photo Card agreed amongst the group.
- Continue to take turns to reveal the Quote Cards one-by-one, discussing each, and matching them to the photos.
- At the end of the game each photo should have a quote next to it. Feel free to re-arrange the Quote Cards as the game progresses and new quotes emerge.

### **GAME END:**

Once you've assigned a photo to each of the quotes, turn over the Answer Card to see how many you matched correctly. As a follow-on activity, you could think about the following question: If you wanted to capture the meaning of volunteering, what would you take a photograph of?
